

Tips for Researching the Position of your Member of Congress

- Visit his/her Official Web site (Of course, the official Web site will cast a light in favor of the Congressperson's position, but it is a good entry point for research). You can find it easily from <http://www.house.gov>
- Look him/her up on Wikipedia (<http://www.wikipedia.org/>)
 - A short personal summary is included on the right side of the page
 - The page will detail any controversy related to the Congressperson and some voting history
 - At the bottom of the page, review the "External Links;" those pages generally contain good information
- Call his/her office and ask for the Policy Aid who works on Climate Change; ask the Aid any policy questions you have. "How does the Congressperson plan to vote on H.R. 2454?" If they talk around the answer, ask them about the Congressperson's environmental concerns; this should give you a quick feel for his/her priorities.
